












From our Transitional Presbyter, Dr. Tom Lovell...

Dear partners in ministry,

I pen this note to you just a few days prior to the observance of Reformation Sunday and All Saints Day, both of which encourage us to celebrate the gifts and witness of those who came before us. As I consider the rich legacy of faith left to us, I cannot help but recall these words from the twelfth chapter of Hebrews: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us also lay aside every weight and sin that clings to us so closely, and let us run with perseverance the race that is before us, looking to Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of our faith...."

As I read these words, a wonderful image pops into my mind. It is the image of a grand coliseum, one even more magnificent than we would find in Auburn or Tuscaloosa. Every seat is filled with the great saints of the Bible and the great saints of the church. Rising from their seats, they shout encouragement to us. It is as if they are saying, "We know it's hard, but keep going. Trust us, we've been where you are. We know the struggle. Persevere! If God was faithful to us, God will be faithful to you. If we could make it through, so can you. Keep running the race, knowing that God is and will always be with you!"

Prior to issuing this pep talk, the author of Hebrews provided his readers with a long list of biblical saints who lived out their faith, encouraging us to follow their example of courage and perseverance. We know these saints and their stories well and can take courage from their witness as we seek to live out our life of faith. We can also take courage from the faith and witness of the leaders of the Reformation: Martin Luther, John Calvin, John Knox, and many others who dared to stand up for what they believed and who also left us a rich legacy of faith upon which we can rely as we seek to be the church today.

In addition to the witness of the saints of scripture and the Reformation, my guess is that each one of us and each of our congregations has our own personal "cloud of witnesses," our own particular list of those who have shaped and molded our faith and impacted the life and ministry of our churches. So let us take time to rejoice in the rich legacy of faith we have inherited and let us also take time to give thanks for the great saints of the past, and for the great saints of the present, whose life and witness inspire us and encourage us to bear faithful witness to the good news of Christ Jesus our Lord.


# Officer Training Saturday, December 9 9:00am—12:00 noon via ZOOM

Friends in Christ,

Thank you so much for having me at North Alabama Presbytery last week for your stated meeting. It was such a privilege to be present as the body accepted the Matthew 25 invitation. We have two upcoming events that I wanted to share with you — one virtual and one in-person. On Monday, October 30, my colleagues in Compassion, Peace & Justice and World Mission will host a Matthew 25 webinar titled In it for the Long Haul: International Accompaniment for Long-Term Sustainable Development. Register today and join us for a discussion of what it means to listen deeply to and center those we accompany as we work together for long-term social change and sustainable development and seek to understand and eradicate systemic poverty.

Our staff is also busy planning for the first-ever <u>Matthew 25 Summit</u>, scheduled for January 16-18 in Atlanta. It's not too far of a drive from North Alabama, so I hope to see some of you there for a

time of listening, learning, and fellowship.

Several of you came up to me during breaks to ask about how you can introduce Matthew 25 to your congregations, and I wanted to share a couple of ideas to get started. First- consider hosting a movie night for your congregation. Art, and specifically film, can speak to us in unexpected ways, stirring emotions and sparking new ideas or new ways of thinking. Fortunately, the Presbyterian Mission Agency has created resources to help congregations explore the three foci of Matthew 25 through film: <u>building congregational vitality</u>, <u>eradicating</u>, <u>systemic poverty</u>, and dismantling structural racism.

Another suggestion would be to invite your Session to walk through the <u>Matthew 25 Bible Study</u> together. This can be done in one meeting or spread across multiple gatherings.

I look forward to the many ways I can celebrate and support your ministries. Please remember that I am just a phone call or an email away!

## **Building for the Future at Old Brick**

Old Brick Presbyterian Church in the Ford City Community is building for the future!



An addition to the current fellowship hall is underway. "We could no longer comfortably accommodate our church family for events, and we needed additional classrooms. This addition will take care of all of our immediate growing challenges." Said Heather Bowling Kimbrough, Old Brick Session Member.

The addition will expand the main area with an opening of 2 sets of French doors to close off when needed to add a classroom. A smaller classroom will be added to the back of the room.









he church had a capitol campaign to help off-set the cost of the building and recently had a chicken dinner fundraiser.





Old Brick Presbyterian Church added an Out-Door Pavilion a few years ago for outdoor worship, concerts and children's activities. "Our congregation continues to grow with regular guest each week and three new members last week", said Pastor Carl Malm.

Old Brick Presbyterian Church is located at 260 Mount Pleasant Road in Muscle Shoals where it was founded in 1820 and continues to thrive in 2023!
