

From our Executive Presbyter, Dr. Tom Lovell...

Dear Partners in Ministry,

Greetings in the name of our risen Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, whose resurrection from the dead has given us new birth into a living hope (I Peter 1:3). Hope is what our celebration of Easter is all about. It is hope that motivates us to believe that there is more to life than what we have seen

or experienced. Hope convinces us that even when life is hard, even when struggles come, even when the evidence is to the contrary, God is and will always be with us. As the Apostle Paul proclaimed to the Corinthians, "If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied."

As God's Easter people, we are called to embrace the hope of God's promise of new life not only for ourselves, but also for the life and ministry of our church. The message of Easter is one of new birth, new beginnings, and new life. It is no secret that being the church is difficult today and it has been difficult for the past couple of decades. Numerous studies over the past several years have documented the decline in membership within mainline Christian denominations. Unfortunately, we Presbyterians are not immune from that trend. Over the past two years I have served as your Executive Presbyter, I have had numerous conversations with Pastors, Sessions, and church members who shared their concerns about the future of their church's ministry.

Yes, there are ample reasons for us to be concerned about the future of the church today, but in the midst of our concerns, this season of new life, new birth, and new beginnings we call Easter beckons us to place our hope for the future of the church as a whole, and our hope for the future of our particular congregation in the power and presence of the one who defeated death and rose to new life on that first Easter morn. There are those who fear that the church is dying, and I can understand that sentiment. However, I do not agree with it, for I believe in the living hope that Christ's resurrection gives to us. While the traditional ways of being church may be slowly fading away, there are a myriad of examples of how the church is being given new life. As author and co-founder of *RootedGood*, Shannon Hopkins, writes, "The church isn't dying. It's being remade. As the 1950s model declines, new ways of being the church are popping up all over, and gospel truths are now being found in new containers."

I firmly believe that if our congregations are going to be faithful witnesses to the good news of Christ's gospel in the coming years, we must break free from the traditions and vestiges of the past which have entombed us for far too long and embrace the living hope of the future God has planned for us. Fortunately, there are numerous resources such as "Project Regneration" available to assist us as we seek to discern and embrace God's future for our Presbytery and our congregations. Over the next few months, I will be sharing some of these resources with you as well as scheduling small group learning and discussion opportunities. I look forward to sharing this adventure with you and rejoicing in the new life God will provide for our congregations and our Presbytery.



The conference will be held at <u>Maryville College</u>, located in Maryville, TN.


Registration fees for youth and adults include conference, housing, and food.
